What is Project TEN?



Project TEN is an international development program that operates volunteer centers in developing areas. We bring together young Jewish adults from all over the world, to a program that combines volunteer work with local communities and service-learning in the fields of international development, culture, identity, and Jewish activism.

- Volunteer in **Ghana, Mexico, Ethiopia, or Israel** – with more locations to come.
- Choose from programs of 1, 3, or 5 months, or a shorter summer program.
- Ask about our special tailor-made programs for groups.
- Actualize your ideals for activism and global *tikkun olam* (repairing the world).
- Volunteer in sustainable projects in three main fields:
 - **Informal education:** English as a second language, basic computer skills, developing leadership skills, creating youth movements, utilizing sports as a means of education
 - **Public Health:** teaching nutrition and hygiene, teaching basic first-aid, de-worming, educating for dental health
 - **Agriculture:** creating sustainable and local agriculture, demonstration farms, environmental education in schools through communal school garden
- **In Israel:** work in platforms for Jewish-Arab co-existence
- Make friends from around the globe: Project TEN includes both Israelis and volunteers from around the world.

Creating sustainable projects in developing communities while providing platforms for young Jewish adults from Israel and around the world to encounter each other and explore what it means to be a Jewish activist.

Our Values

We know that understanding the local culture is a process. We also promote sustainability. We either join our partners' existing projects, or work with them to create new ones – with an eye toward communal independence.

Putting the “Learning” into Service-Learning

In Project TEN the volunteer service and the study process complement and enrich each other. The curriculum includes three components: **Training** for your volunteer placement; **ethics** in international development; and **culture and identity**. The latter includes study of the local language, cuisine, literature, and history; your group’s internal culture; and Jewish activism—the global Jewish values that call us to be the change we wish to see in the world.

Project TEN in Israel

In a Jewish service-learning program, you can't get any closer to the center of Jewish history, and the Jewish future, than Israel, and despite Israel's strong economy, like many countries, it has vulnerable regions. Project TEN has two centers in Israel: one in the northern region (the Galilee) and one in the south (the Negev).
